Our Garden

We like to give a termly update about our garden at nursery as it is so important to us. The vegetables are continuing to grow and are being cared for by the children. We have beautiful flowers on our courgettes, marrows, beans and nasturtiums. We harvested our potatoes and strawberries and the children enjoyed eating them at snack time. We have planted some more pumpkin seeds and the small plants are healthy and have been planted out in the pumpkin patch. We hope to have more vegetables and fruit as time goes on, and those that do not provide food for us, will feed the caterpillars and other bugs in the garden. We have noticed and identified at least 8 different butterflies and moths in the garden so far.



The children have also enjoyed exploring water in the garden and continue to find out more about the various minibeasts they find.

Core Books

During June and July we have enjoyed sharing the following books and doing lots of activities linked to them: **Katie In London** – As we were thinking about the Queen's Platinum Jubilee, we shared this story about a girl called Katie who visits different sites in London on the back of a Trafalgar Square lion, including a visit to see the Queen. **We're Going To Find The Monster** – We had a visit from Penguin Books who shared this story with us about a sister and brother who look for the monster who lives in their house – in the style of 'We're Going On A Bear Hunt'. **The Very Hungry Caterpillar** – A timeless story about a caterpillar eating different foods and eventually changing into a butterfly – it mixes facts and fiction and is always popular as we find caterpillars and butterflies in the garden.

Tadpole's Promise – A story about a caterpillar and tadpole who become friends and do not want each other to change – they inevitably do change having tragic consequences, which causes children to question and think.

Mr. Gumpy's Outing – A story about a man who takes children and animals on a boat trip so long as they behave well – they don't behave well and all end up falling in the river – this links to our learning about water.

Who Sank The Boat? – Another story about a boat ride where different animals climb into the boat one at a time – which one will sink the boat? This story has links to capacity, size and science.

I Am Too Absolutely Small For School – A story about Charlie and Lola where Lola is convinced she does not need to go to school, and finds out lots of things about school from her older brother Charlie.

The Colour Monster Goes To School – Another story about the colour monster experiencing different emotions as he starts school. This book is good for exploring the children's emotions as they prepare to start new schools.

Ruby's Worry – This story explores the idea about having a worry and how to deal with it – many children may have worries at this time and can learn that it helps to share their worries with others.

Handa's Surprise – This is our core book for the 2s this half term – it is about Handa who prepares a basket of fruit for her friend, Akeyo, but along the journey the fruit slowly disappears and they both have a surprise in the end.
