


This week our core book is 'We're Going On A Bear Hunt'








Join in with the actions (in italics) for our core song:

Makaton

Go for a walk in the park and act out the story as you walk along. Stop when you come to some grass, some mud, a puddle, the trees, and maybe even a cave! Use the words from the story -"We can't go over it, we can't go under it. Oh no! We've got to go through it!" as you move through these different areas. What did you find in the cave? Maybe you could make up more obstacles along the way.





Changing Materials



We are exploring how different materials can change. Water freezes to form ice and ice melts to form water. Why not explore what happens:

- Put some small toys in a container of water and freeze it. How will you break the toys free from the ice?
- Put salt on some ice cubes? What happens? What can you build?

(NB always be careful when handling ice as it can burn).

What other materials change? Eq. Look at the mixture when you bake a cake. What do you find out?

Positional Language

We use positional language all the time - eg. in, on, under, above, between, next to, through, over, around, behind. Here are some ideas:

- Go to the playground and use the equipment, or create an obstacle course at home, and put yourself in different positions.
- Find a large cardboard box and play a game where you go in, under, next to, etc the box. You could use a smaller box and a toy.
- Use positional language as you play at home - eq. the car is in the garage, the crayon is next to the paper, my dinner is on the plate.
