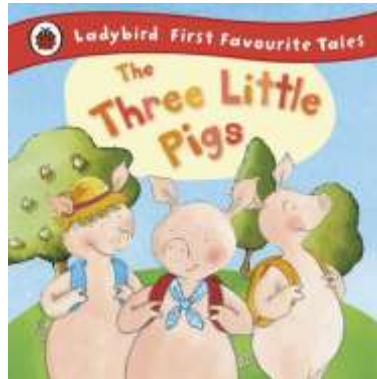


Fortnight beginning 30/01/23

Where I'll be snug and warm.

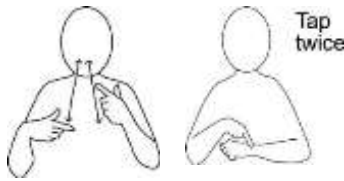


You can help your child by reading with your child every day, singing our core song together, and reciting and acting out the poem.

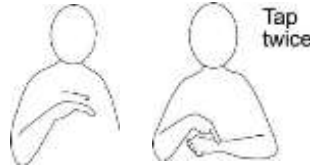
## Makaton

We are learning these Makaton signs:

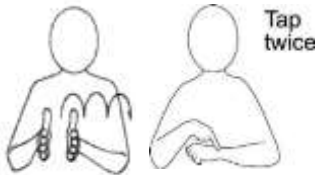
Lunch time

## Bird Watch

Join in the Big Garden Bird Watch this weekend. Go to the park for one hour and count the birds you see. They must land on the ground or in a tree to be counted. ## Make a bird feeder

At this time of year small birds need our help. There are not many insects or berries for them to eat. We can help feed them by making bird feeders to hang in our gardens or balconies. Thread small pieces of apple or some raisins on a pipe cleaner. Twist the ends together and hang on a branch or something the birds can easily land on. You could also use a cereal such as Cherrios.
