

## Fortnight beginning 17/04/23

"How are you today?"


But the wiggly worm just wriggled away.

# Den Making



Den making is really good fun on a rainy day inside or a sunny day outside.

You can make a cosy den indoors with chairs and some blankets. Pop some cushions inside and get comfy with a book or a snack. Outside vou

could use garden furniture and sheets. Or, if you are in the woods, you could find some

really big sticks and build a wooden den.



#### Make a Seed Bomb



Wildflowers are good for bees, butterflies, and other insects. We can help these important insects by planting flowers for them. A fun way to do this is by

making Seed Bombs. It is even more fun to go to the park with our Seed Bombs and throw them into the bushes or grass for them to grow.

How to make a Seed Bomb

- 1. Mix 1 small handful of wildflower seed mix with 5 small handfuls of soil.
- 2. Stir in a little water and mix together.
- 3. Roll the mixture into firm balls.
- 4. Leave the balls to dry in a sunny spot.
- 5. Take your Seed Bombs to the park and throw them into a muddy patch. Come back to check on your seeds to see if they are growing.



### I Spy...

A fun game to play with friends and family to help develop letter sound (phonemic) awareness. Gather some small, familiar objects from around the house and put them on a tray. This could be anything e.g. a spoon, a pen, an apple, a coin, a key, a pebble, a toothbrush, a block, an egg. Choose up to 10 objects.

Place them on a tray and name each item to make sure you all know what the items are called, emphasising the initial sound. The grown up starts the game by saying "I spy, with my little eye, something beginning with the letter sound sssss". Just use the initial letter sound (phoneme). Wait a few moments for the game players

to look at all the items on the tray to match the object with the sound. Repeat for each of the objects.
