
Three weeks beginning 17/06/24

stones,


And reach the other side.

Water Investigations

There are many ways to explore water:

Investigate capacity - at bath time or when playing with water, fill different shaped containers with water. Can you find 2 that hold the same amount of water? How do you know?



Explore ice - fill a small container with water and freeze it in the freezer. How long does the ice take to melt? Do you think it melts quicker in the Summer or Winter? Why do you think that?





Use some food packaging recycled paper to make a boat that floats on water. Can your boat carry a load from one side of the water to the other?

What can you find out about your family history, culture and traditions? Do you have any special family songs or stories you could teach your friends? Do you have a favourite family recipe you could share with us at nursery?


Counting Games

Here are some counting games you can play:









- make some using paper). Share out the dominoes. Take turns to match the same number of dots together (see picture). If you cannot go, knock on the table. The winner is the first person to use up all their dominoes.
- Jacks You need a bouncy ball and some jacks or small stones. Throw the ball up, letting it bounce once while you pick up a jack in the same hand before catching the ball. See how many jacks you can pick up.
- Track games You can draw a track on paper or use chalk to draw on paving stones on the pavement. Mark the start and finish of the track. Throw a dice and move the number of dots on the dice. Keep going until you reach the finish.
