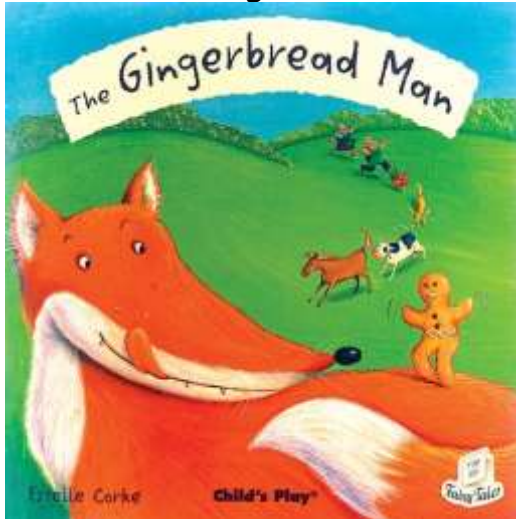


Fortnight Beginning 17/11/25

Signs of Autumn

Autumn is wonderful season to notice changes in nature. Using your Autumnngo! Sheet, take a look around you and try to spot some of the signs of Autumn.



Bake Gingerbread People

A simple recipe to make gingerbread people. You could re-tell the story of the runaway 'Gingerbread Man' with your biscuits.



*350g plain flour *1 tsp bicarb of soda

*2 tsp ground ginger *1 tsp ground cinnamon

*125g butter *175g sugar



*1 egg *4 tbsp golden syrup



Method

1. Mix flour, bicarbonate of soda, ginger and cinnamon.
2. Add butter and blend until it looks like breadcrumbs. Stir in sugar.
3. Beat egg and golden syrup together, add to mixture until it clumps together.
4. Knead until smooth. Wrap in cling film. Chill in fridge for 15 mins.
5. Line two baking trays with greaseproof paper.
6. Roll out. Using cutters, cut out the gingerbread people shapes. Place on baking tray.
7. Bake in oven (160 deg/gas 4) for 12-15 mins, or until golden brown.
