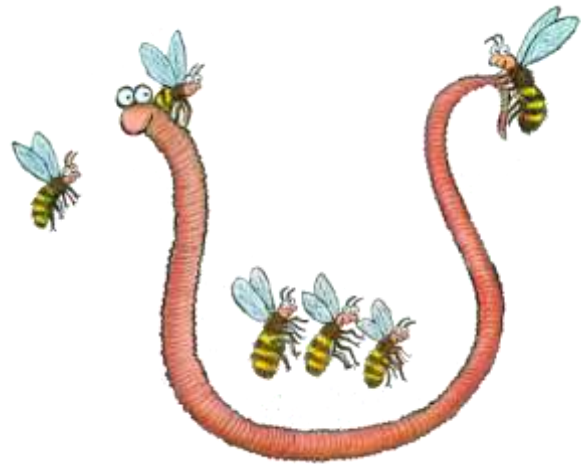


This fortnight our core book is 'Superworm'

Under A Stone

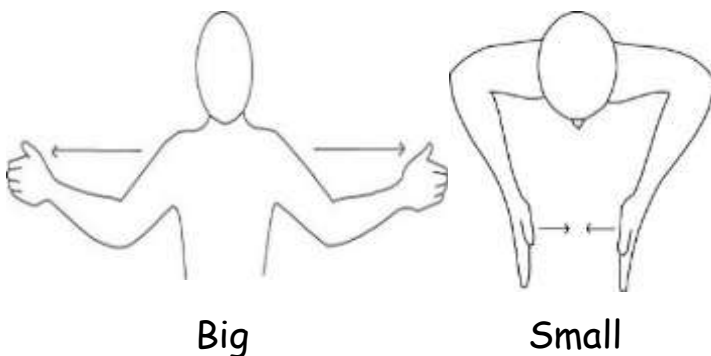
Under a stone where the earth was firm,

But the wiggly worm just wriggled away.



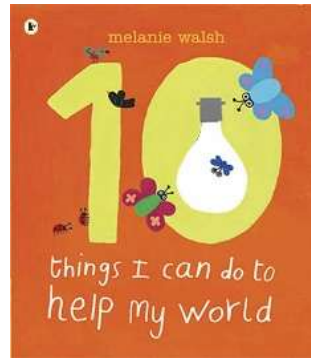
You can help your child by reading with your child every day, singing our core song together, and reciting and acting out the poem.
